Annual Meeting & Picnic

Proposed Residential Development for South Ridge

Recently, RHOA Board members met with Heritage Management Services to discuss a residential development proposed for South Ridge, the empty subdivision located at the southeast corner of The Ridges. Heritage designs, builds and manages independent living, assisted living and memory support communities. The company's founders and management have long-standing ties to Omaha and are strongly active in our community.

This proposed residential community would comprise roughly half the South Ridge parcel and would consist of most of the exterior perimeter lots that overlook 180th St and West Center Rd. The proposed development

would be 2-story, with landscaping and materials that would comply with the residential integrity of The Ridges. Another Heritage residential development similar to the one proposed for South Ridge is Heritage Pointe, located at the northwest corner of 168th and Blondo Sts. The remaining interior South Ridge lots would be developed as residential, providing a buffer between the Heritage development and the existing nearby subdivisions of Crimson Ridge and Saddle Ridge.

A presentation on the proposed residential development will be given by Heritage Management Services at our Annual Meeting on June 13. The Board supports this proposed development for South Ridge, and we encourage all residents to come to the Annual Meeting to ask questions and learn more about it.

General Announcements:

Save the Date – An overnight camp out will be held on the common area located in Crimson Ridge on September 18. Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult. Contact the RHOA property manager for more information.

Annual Dues payments were due March 15. Please be aware that late annual dues payments are subject to interest penalties. To avoid lien placement, payment in full of RHOA annual dues must be received before June 15.

Slow Down! Now that the weather is nice and our residents are out and about, please slow down and watch for children when driving through our neighborhood. If you are a parent of a teenage driver, please remind them as well that the speed limit in our neighborhood is 25 mph!

Let's Talk Trash - Since annexation of The Ridges by Omaha, our neighborhood has two trash, recycling and yard waste pick up days per week. The city's provider, Deffenbaugh, picks up on Fridays, and several private companies pick up on Mondays. Neighborhood wide, twice weekly litter removal will be performed by SBS Group as soon after Monday and Friday trash collections as possible to help reduce the amount of litter in our neighborhood. Yard Market will continue to pick up litter when they are performing routine grounds care on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Litter removal will be on our main thoroughfares

of Shadow Ridge Drive, 189th Street and Center Ridge Drive and will include all main and secondary entrance areas. Please feel free to join in this effort to keep our neighborhood clean and beautiful by stopping to pick up litter whenever possible.

Grounds Care and Annual Flowers – Please

be advised that Yard Market will apply 5-step fertilization and pesticide/herbicide treatments on right-of-way and common area lawns throughout the growing season. Annual flowers should be installed by the end of May.

Premium Tree Care

Eden Tree Pros will be in our neighborhood throughout the season treating and maintaining our trees. Please be aware that tree spraying may take place near your home.

Wet Paint! Neighborhood entrance signs and mailbox doors will be repainted this year by Knock It Out Painting. Work should begin soon, so be careful of wet paint when using your mailbox.

Sprinklers – Please flag and/or report the location of malfunctioning sprinkler heads as soon as possible to the RHOA property manager, or you may report the location directly to Matt McClellan with McClellan Irrigation at 660-0909.

Right-of-way (ROW) & Easement Maintenance

Some homeowner lots located along Shadow **Ridge Drive Center Ridge** Drive and near entrance areas, have permanent **RHOA** landscape easements located on or near their front, side and/or back yards. Lots located near RHOAowned common areas may also have access easements located on their property. As per the covenants, and as indicated on plats filed with Douglas County, RHOA reserves the right to determine what is planted or placed on landscape easements. **RHOA** maintains all RHOA-owned common areas, and performs routine maintenance on most public right-of-way and easements in our neighborhood. Contact the RHOA property manager if you have questions about rightof-way, easement or common area maintenance near your home.



Trash cans, recycling bins, yard waste and other containers must be completely screened from view except for days when items are scheduled to be picked up.

Camper, trailer, boat and RV storage

is not permitted on homeowner property more than three (3) days in any given month.

Yard signs, including contractor, political and event signs, are prohibited on homeowner lots. However, residents are allowed to display Shadow Ridge Country

All sports teams requesting practice times must provide proof of insurance naming The Ridges as an additional insured for a minimum of \$1 million.



Tree Care Tips

With spring officially upon us and summer knocking on our doors, now is a great time to review tips for maintaining vigor in your trees and shrubs.

- Mulch around the base of trees and shrubs to regulate soil temperature, conserve moisture and minimize soil compaction. Mulch should be no more than 4 inches thick and should be pulled 6 inches away from the base of trees and shrubs.
- Provide a slow, deep watering 1-2 times weekly during hot summer months, especially for shallow-rooted trees like maples and birches. Place the hose 2-3 feet from the base and set at a slow trickle for about an hour.
- Remove diseased and dead branches right away to prevent spread of disease, and remove suckers and sprouts from the base of trunks and branches.

Most applications are reviewed weekly; however, new construction and large-scale projects may require submission of plans or materials and further review by the DRB at their monthly meeting. Lawn & Garden Hints

Here are a few easy things to do to help keep your lawn and garden under control and looking good throughout the summer:

- Beware of insects such as aphids and other bugs that become rampant as our plants grow larger and have less circulation between them.
- Prune back your rose bushes after the first bloom. You can either dead head the spent blooms or do a major cut back to keep them tame and under control.
- Continue to pinch back all late summer and fall perennials to keep them bushy and healthy and to stagger blooming times.
- Be sure to mow at the proper height. Cutting your lawn too short can cause many problems in the future.
- Lastly, feed your lawn the proper nutrients to keep it healthy and looking lush during the hot summer months.
